- Turnoff your monitor when you leave your table. Whenever possible, shutdown rather than logging off.
- Turnoff unnecessary lights and use day light instead
- Use LED or Compact fluorescent bulbs as much as possible.
- Switch off lights fans in conference rooms, class rooms and lecture halls when they are not in use. Avoid the use of decorative lighting
- Use the fans only when they are needed
- In hostels install water heaters with non-conventional energy resources
- To reduce local air pollution emission using bicycles, public transportation and use of
